2. What Is a Stimulus Check? (Semantic SEO Foundation)

3b. Unclaimed \$1,400 Stimulus Payments 2026 — IRS Recovery Rebate Credit

4. SSI, SSDI & Low-Income Stimulus Payment 2026

Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) recipients are among the most vulnerable populations when it comes to stimulus payments. Here is everything SSI and SSDI recipients need to know about **stimulus payment eligibility in 2026**.

4a. SSI Recipients

SSI recipients automatically qualified for all three COVID-era stimulus checks without filing a tax return. 4b. Low-Income Stimulus Payment Eligibility

Low-income Americans who do not typically file tax returns face unique challenges when claiming stimulus payments. The IRS created the Non-Filer tool to help these individuals register for payments. Key programs benefiting low-income individuals in 2026 include:

- **Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC):** Worth up to \$7,430 for qualifying families in 2026
- **Child Tax Credit (CTC):** Up to \$2,000 per qualifying child
- **Additional Child Tax Credit (ACTC):** Refundable portion up to \$1,600 per child
- **Recovery Rebate Credit:** For those who missed prior stimulus checks
